

About us

Founded in 2008, the Wiltshire Parent Carer Council or 'WPCC' is an independent, voluntary organisation which is managed and run by parent carers, for parent carers.



We have a membership of approximately 2,500 parent carers across Wiltshire whose children range in age (0-25yrs) and in the type of special educational needs and/or disabilities they have.

These include physical, sensory, learning, behaviour, mental health, communication, rare or undiagnosed conditions, complex health needs and autistic spectrum disorders (also known as ASC or AS), amongst others.





What we do

We provide a consultation and participation service which enables parent carers to have a voice about services and support their children and families use.

Perhaps more significantly, this service offers real opportunities to influence and shape provision across the local area.

We also provide the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information Service (SENDIS) which offers a wealth of information as well as signposting to specialist services.



How we're funded

The WPCC receives funding in the form of grants from both central government (Department for Education) and our local authority, Wiltshire Council.

Consultation & Participation

Parent carers know their children better than anyone else; they understand their needs and the daily difficulties and challenges they and their families face in their quest to lead normal and fulfilling lives.

Through raising their own children, they have also gained first-hand experience of using services. By listening to what parent carers have to say, we identify what is working well, what needs improving and where the gaps are in provision.

The feedback gathered is used by WPCC parent representatives to influence decisions about local services provided by Wiltshire Council, NHS and other agencies. We attend regular meetings and work directly with strategic leads and commissioners. We all work together to ensure services are meeting the needs of local families more fully. The voice of parent carers continually influences the way in which services are being delivered in Wiltshire, including the Short Breaks Scheme.

In 2009 Wiltshire's model of parent participation for delivering short breaks received national recognition, cited as an example of good practice in the Green Paper 'Support & Aspiration'.



As a result of parent participation in Wiltshire, we have seen the introduction of Youth Clubs for young people with ASD, a wider eligible age range for the Short Breaks Scheme, Supported Internships, Positive Activity Clubs for young people with SEND, and much more.
