- Think about who will take over their care
- Will they need financial support
- O Consider setting up a discretionary trust to avoid affecting their meanstested benefits (giving money directly could disqualify loved ones from benefits)

CHOOSING EXECUTORS

- Choose someone you trust
- Choose someone who is capable of handling financial and legal matters
- O Choose someone who understands your caring situation
- If you do not have someone close to you who could become an executor, you can appoint professional executors
